The Harry and Polly Slife Minority Scholarships are awarded each year to two African-American students from the Waterloo School District. Awards are renewable up to a total of four years if students achieve a grade point average of 2.0 or higher. Recipients are required to live in a campus residence hall. **Deadline for application is March 15.**

TO QUALIFY

- Candidates must be seniors graduating in the spring of the current academic year.
- Candidates must rank in the upper half of their graduating class and have a grade point average of at least 2.25 on a 4.0 scale.
- Candidates must have applied and been accepted for admission to Wartburg prior to the March 15 deadline.
- Candidates must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by the state of lowa deadline. If this deadline is not met and the student is found to be eligible, a reduction in the scholarship may occur.

TO APPLY

- Complete the application form on the reverse side of this sheet.
- List your community and extracurricular activities on a separate sheet. Include awards and honors you have received as well as volunteer and leadership positions you have held.
- Write a 250-500 word essay on how you would benefit from a Wartburg education.
- Enclose two recommendations: one from a high school teacher and the other from a person unrelated to you who has known you outside the classroom through employment, church, activities, community service, athletics, etc.
